To put it simply, the goalpost moved and we must adapt.

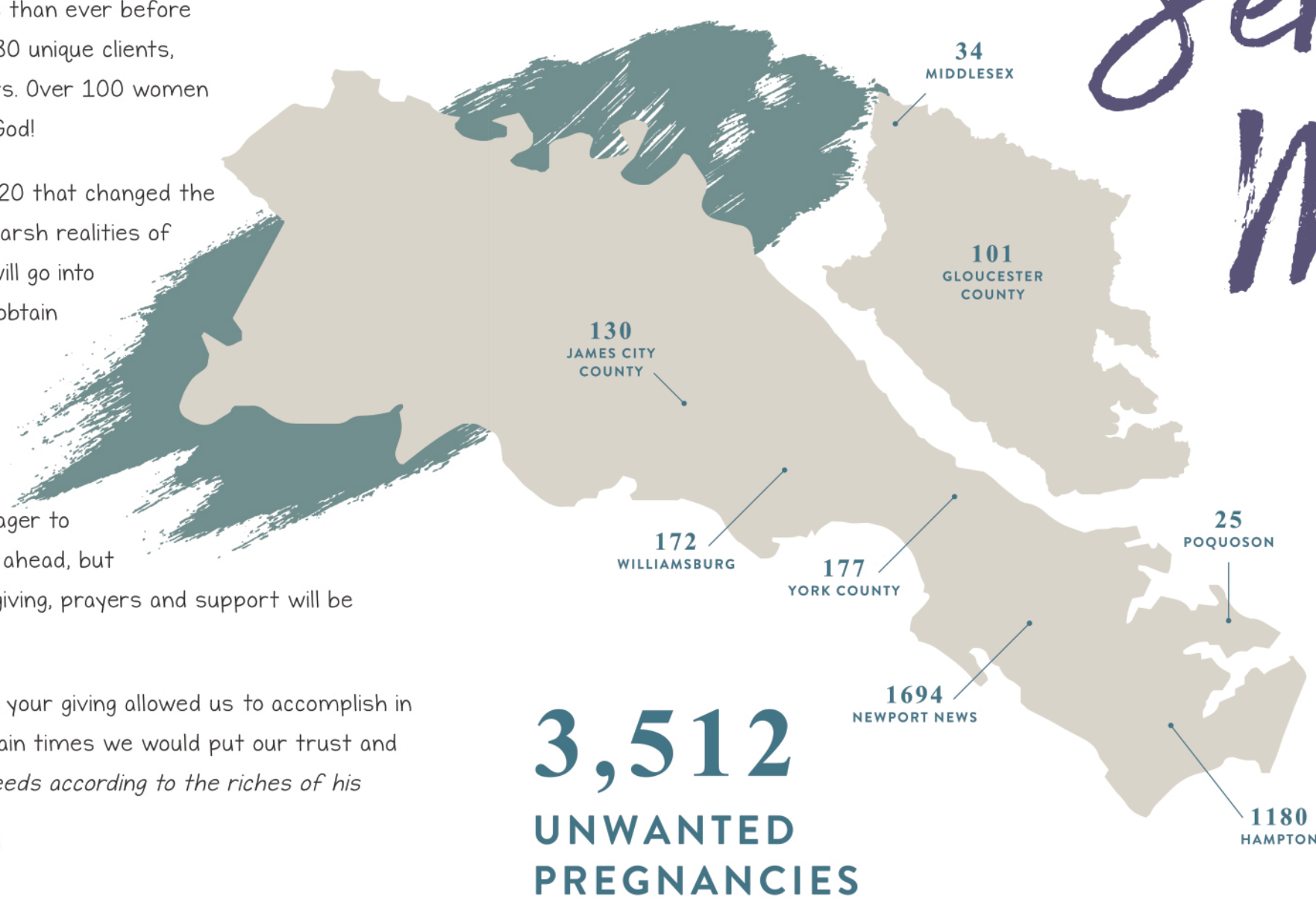

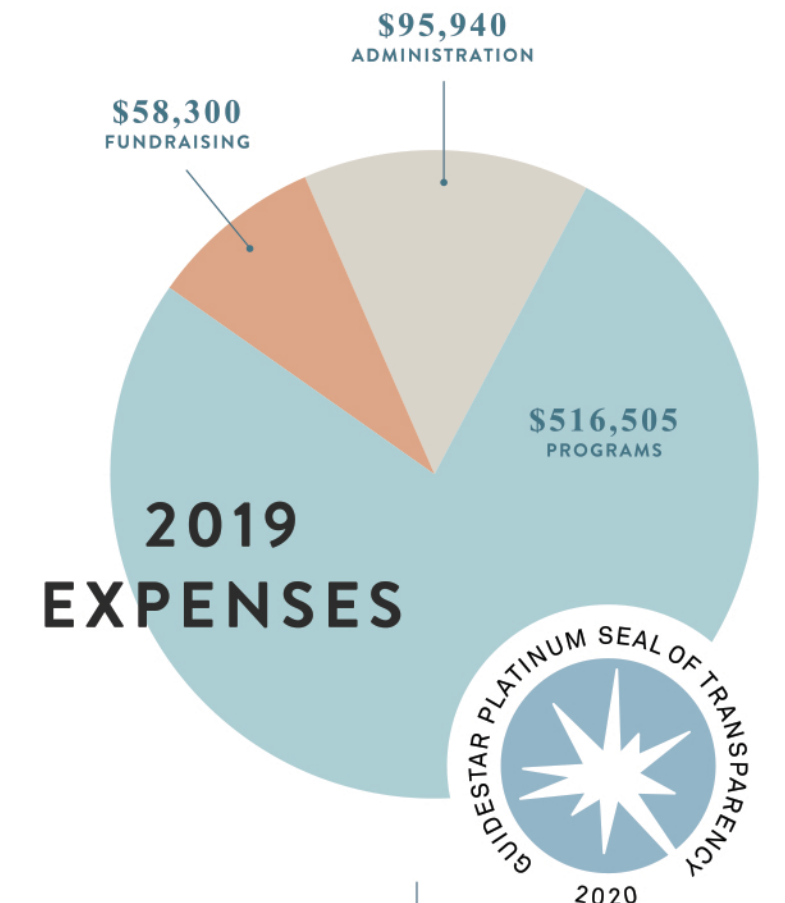
